Please note: Conviction of a crime is not an automatic disqualification for employment. Factors such as age at the time of the offence, remoteness of the offence in time, and rehabilitation will be taken into account in determining the effect on suitability for this position.

Under the Criminal Records (Clean Slate) Act 2004 you do not need to declare your New Zealand conviction if all the following apply (unless stated in the exceptions):

- It has been more than 7 years since your most recent conviction and you have not re-offended; and
- You have never had a custodial sentence imposed on you; and
- You have paid any fines/costs/compensation/reparation ordered by the court

Regardless of how long ago you were convicted, you are not eligible to conceal your conviction if:

- You have ever been convicted of a sexual offence; or
- You have ever been disqualified from holder a drivers licence for repeat offending involving alcohol/drugs; or
- The conviction was from overseas.

A custodial sentence means a sentence of imprisonment and includes corrective training, preventative detention, home detention, borstal training, detention centre training. Or any other sentence that required the full-time detentions of an individual.
