Recommendations

It is recommended that the Governing Council:

1. **Notes** the timeline for finalising the Strategic Plan 2022–2027 to ensure it is published on our website by 30 June 2022
2. **Notes** the Strategic Plan will only be published on the website, meeting our obligation under section 483(1) of the Education and Training Act 2020.

Purpose

1. The purpose of this paper is to advise of the steps taken and yet to be taken to ensure the Strategic Plan 2022–2027 is published online by 30 June 2022.

Background

2. In accordance with section 483(1) of the Education and Training Act 2020 the Teaching Council | Matatū Aotearoa must consult with teachers, the Government, and the public to draft a report setting out its strategic direction for the next five years. This must be reviewed and published online at least every three years.
3. The current strategic plan was published in June 2019. Council expected to be able to consult on a new draft strategic plan several months ago, but priority had to be given to the consultation on fees and levies, which has taken longer than expected.
4. A consultation draft of the proposed new strategic plan was approved by the Governing Council at its hui on 27 April, with final sign-off by the Chair and Deputy Chair on behalf of Council on 11 May.
5. The consultation documents were published online on Wednesday 18 May 2022 and teachers, government agencies, key stakeholders and the public were invited to provide their feedback by 3 June 2022.
6. Seven hui were chaired by Advisory Group Chairs between 24 - 31 May 2022 to provide feedback from groups in the early childhood, inclusive education, and Pacific spaces.
7. Council Executive Team members also discussed the draft strategic plan in their scheduled meetings with key stakeholders/peak bodies occurring during the consultation period.
8. The consultation period closed at 5pm on Friday 3 June. A total of 246 online submissions have been received, which have been coded and analysed.
9. The analysis of all feedback and recommendations for changes to the draft strategic plan are reported in the companion papers 2 and 3.

Next steps

10. Any changes approved by the Governing Council at its meeting on 16 June 2022 will be incorporated into the final draft of the Strategic Plan.
11. The final draft Strategic Plan will proceed to final editing, proof-reading, translation, and design stages aiming for online publication on 30 June 2022.
12. Due to the tight timeframe, it is proposed that any final editing is signed off by the Chair and Deputy Chair on behalf of the whole Governing Council.
13. The final Strategic Plan 2022–2027 will be published only on our webpages, partly as a cost-saving measure. Online publication meets our legal obligations under the Act.

Timetable for completion of Strategic Plan 2022–2027

The timetable for publishing the final Strategic Plan 2022–2027 is tight and is expected to proceed as follows:
